Project Judging Guidelines

Fair Booths

Theme is "Rippin at the Fayette County Fair"

Advisor will contact youth about 4-H Booth decorating/set-up in the Youth Building

Dates: Saturday, July 15, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

All booths will be judged for development around theme, ability to attract attention, neatness, originality, members involved in set-up, display of projects and names of the advisors and club members (can be first name only).

Booths may be dismantled, items removed between 12:00 noon and 2:00 pm on Saturday July 22. Exhibits may not be removed earlier. Any items left in booth after 2:00 pm will become the property of the Fayette County Agricultural Society. Miscellaneous projects should be picked up before noon. No supervision will be available.

Projects are displayed at own risk of damage or destruction.

To sign up for a fair booth call the Fayette County Extension office (740-335-1150) before deadline June 23 and sign up for whole or half booth.
















The horse's ears and actions are the key to his emotions. He can tell you what he is paying attention to and how he feels by the way he uses his ears and the way he acts. Following are some tips to his emotions.







Ears pointed left and right relaxed, paying attention to the scenery on both sides.




Ears turned back but relaxed listening to his rider or what's behind him





Ears pointed stiffly forward larmed or nervous about what ahead. Looking out for danger



Ears stiffly back annoyed or worried about what's behind him; might kick if annoyed.



calm and resting, horse may be dozing



Ears flattened against neck violently angry, in a fighting mood. May fight, bite or kick.


OTHER SIGNS YOU SHOULD NOTICE ARE,

· Tucking the tail down tightly. Danger to the rear. Horse may bolt, buck or kick. Watch out if ears are flattened too!


· Switching the tail.

Annoyance and irritation:

- at biting flies, stinging insects or tickling bothersome actions of a rider or another horse.
- Droopy ears and resting one hind leg on toe.
 Calm and resting, horse may be dozing.
 Don't wake him up by startling him!
- · Wrinkling up the face and swinging the head. Threatening gesture of an angry or bossy horse Watch out for biting or kicking.

Show Rules

- Youth at least 8 years old and in the third grade through 18 years old (as of 1/1/2023) may participate, regardless of 4-H membership.
- Purebred and mixed-breed rabbits and poultry may be entered.

Each breed of rabbit will be shown in four divisions: Sr Buck, Jr Buck, Sr Doe and Jr Doe A breed will require at least five rabbits to be separated as a breed.

Poultry Classes: Commercial and Fancy (NO MEAT).

- · Entries are not limited.
- Entries are made the day of the show.
- Rabbits and Poultry must be in carrying cages with leak proof bottoms.
- A "free" raffle ticket will be given for every five entries entered under the same exhibitor.
- The Rabbit & Poultry Committee and the Hartford Independent Fair Board will not be responsible in the case of fire, theft, or accident; however, precautions will be taken to avoid any mishap.
- Youth must bring their own entry to the table.
