What Are The Behavior Expectations of 4-H Participants?

4-H Code of Conduct

- 4-H members, parents/legal guardians, and other adults participating in 4-H activities will:
- 1. Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
- Conduct themselves in a courteous, ethical, respectful manner, use appropriate language (including not using profanity), exhibit good sportsmanship, and provide positive role models.
- Abstain from illegal behaviors, use of alcohol, illegal or illicit drugs, tobacco in any form, and/or any vaping products during 4-H events and activities.
- 4. Fully participate in scheduled activities.
- 5. Respect other's property and privacy rights.
- Abstain from child abuse (physical and/or verbal)
 harassment, and actions that bully, ridicule, dominate, or
 display inappropriate behavior toward others.
- 7. Accept personal responsibility for behavior, destruction or theft of property including any financial damage.
- 8. Be responsible for any financial damage caused by inappropriate behavior.
- 9. Adhere to rules of safety.
- 10. I will uphold and support the responsible and lawful use of social media. In so doing, I will not create or post social media content that is abusive, threatening, defamatory, obscene, harassing, or creates a hostile environment.
- Follow the Ohio State University Standards of Behavior for Minor Participants Participating in Activities and Programs with Minor Participants.
- Consequences for violation:
 - Removal from participation in the event (at the individual's expense);
 - Sanctions on participating in future 4-H events;
 - Forfeiture of awards, financial earnings from the event;
 - · Removal from offices/positions held, etc.
 - Behavior outside of 4-H activities can affect "member in good standing" or "volunteer in good standing" status.
 - It is the responsibility of all program participants to reinforce the code of conduct and intervene when necessary to enforce the rules.







4-H members and their parents/legal guardians must agree to the 4-H Code of Conduct as part of the 4-H Enrollment process.

What Are The Special Fair Requirements for Projects?



Quality Assurance: 4-H members with Market Beef, Market Dairy Steer, Market Hog, Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Turkey, Market Chicken, Market Duck, Market Rabbits, Lactating Dairy Cows and/or Lactating Dairy Goats must complete the ANNUAL quality assurance (QA) <u>no later than June 3</u> to show and/or sell at the Fayette County and/or Ohio State Fairs.

EquiSTEP: All 4-H horse project members will need to complete the on-line EquiSTEP program no later than June 3.

Dog, Horse and Shooting Sports Permission to Participate: Members that enroll in these projects will be prompted to read and accept these permission to participate forms as part of the on-line 4-H enrollment process no later than March 1.

Skillathon and Project Judging: All 4-H members <u>must</u> participate in Skillathon/Project judging with an up-to-date current <u>project book</u> to complete their projects and be eligible to show at the Fayette County and/or Ohio State Fairs. If you need to make-up skill-a-thon or project judging, you must request a make-up time slot <u>no later than June 12, 2024</u>. Health Requirements: All animals must be free of any contagious or infectious disease upon arrival and throughout Fair week. For specific requirements see the Fayette County Fair Book at fayettecofairoh.com

What Does My Child Need To Do in 4-H?

◆ 4-H Club Meetings

- Attend at least six 4-H club meetings and/or activities.
- Participate in community service, leadership, fundraising, recreational and/or educational activities.
- Come with a positive attitude eager to Learn by Doing the 4-H way through project work, public speaking and hands-on activities.
- Serve as a club officer, on a committee, as a Jr. Leader or mentor.
- Support club goals and activities.

For Projects

- Select at least one 4-H project to complete.
 Use 4-H Project Central on-line to get a sneak peak of each project or the 2024 4-H Family Guide.
- Meet all project requirements and guidelines.
 Refer to the 2024 Fayette County 4-H Requirement
 Guide on-line at http://fayette.osu.edu.
- Attend required programs for Fair participation, weigh-in, tag-in, notch sheet turn in, quality assurance (QA), EquiSTEP, skill-a-thon, project judging, etc.

For Skillathon & Project Judging

- Up-to-date Project Book: Required for all projects!
 Complete required sections to be eligible for County and State Fair participation. Make sure to include a feed tag/ration, quality assurance certificate & project experiences documentation. A current up-to-date project book is a REQUIREMENT to have a completed project eligible for FAIR!
- **Project Interview:** Prepare for a one-on-one interview with an adult to answer questions about your project and 4-H experience.
- Skillathon: All animal projects! Prepare to participate in four skill assessment stations. Use your project book, resource handbook, skill-a-thon study guide, quality assurance, clinics and workshops to prepare. Check out digital links at http://Fayette.osu.edu
 Miscellaneous Projects: Bring item made, created, produced, grown, or designed and/or visual educational display (tri-fold, poster, collage, etc.) to the judging & interview.
- Be Patient and Positive! While you wait for judging, review your project book, bring something to read or chat with a friend.









What Does My Child Need To Do in 4-H? continued.

- For Fair
- Make Entries: By deadline set, June 5, 2024, at <u>fairentry.com</u>
 Instructions can be found at Fayette.osu.edu under Jr. Fair
- Fair Wrist Bands: Are distributed via your advisors, they will share how your club distributes them. You must have completed all project requirements in a minimum of 1 project to be eligible to receive your fair wrist band.
- **Club Booth Set-Up:** Saturday, July 13, 9am 12pm. Clubs will contact the Extension office to designate booth size. No required but strongly encouraged. Items in booths are placed in at own risk.
- Required Paperwork: Present proof of vaccinations (dogs), NPIP (market poultry), Negative Pullorum test (fancy and production poultry), Complete Drug Use Notification Form On-line (market and lactating animals), Pedigrees/Registration Papers (breeding beef, dairy female, market breed hogs, breeding gilts).
- **Exhibition Times:** Bring 4-H projects by required times to the Fair, follow rules and information in the Fair Book.
- **Project Care:** Assure quality care for your animals at all times. Keep stalls and animals clean, fed, watered and presentable to the public.

- 8. Fun with friends, new and old, through recreation, social, educational and/ or competitive activities.
- A welcoming place for you and your child to learn, grow and work together in 4-H

What Will 4-H Cost?

- ✓ County 4-H Activity Fee: \$10/member & \$5/cloverbud

 These are paid to your club advisors
- ☑ Club Fees: Some clubs charge a per member and/or family fee based on the club's activities. Fees are used for field trips, programming, club t-shirt, booth/barn decorating, etc.
- Project Books: <u>Purchase through your club.</u> Books can be purchased during off times of the 4-H year to work ahead via the Extension Office
 - Project Books \$8-\$21 + sales tax. Resource Books-\$12-\$20 + sales tax. Pay by check or cash. No refunds!
- ✓ **Project Items:** Every project has costs beyond the 4-H book. You may need to buy an animal, purchase special equipment, buy feed, food or supplies. Please keep this in mind when making project selections.
- ☑ Camps: Camp fees can range dependent on member activity selection. Base fee is ~ \$270/ 4-H camper. Cloverbud camp: ~\$65/camper.
- ☑ Fair: If you plan to participate in Fair, you will have additional costs associated with your 4-H experience. Additional Passes or open show entries can have additional cost.
 - Fair Passes: Check Fair web site for current prices.
 - ◆ Open Class Entries: Purchase exhibitor pass & pay entry fee.
