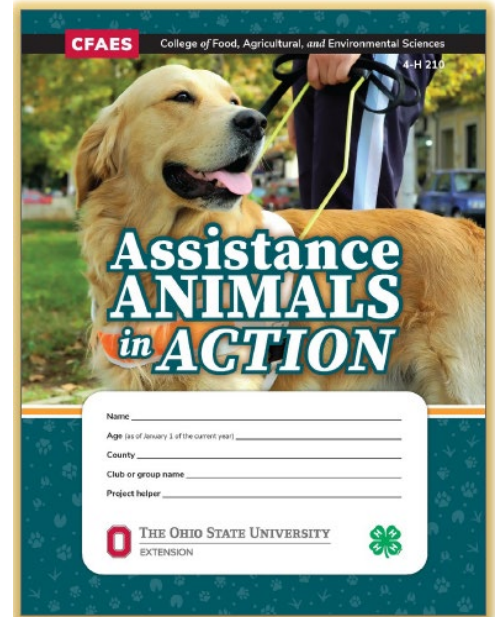

ALL QA MUST BE COMPLETED BY JUNE 3, 2024. FFA members (8th grade included) receive their certification through class. FFA teachers send us the list. If members attended a program outside of the county, they must provide a certificate of completion. If kids decide to complete the online YQCA, we need your completion certificate. If it was completed after October of 2023, it will count towards their 2024 QA requirement.

Include a moving part in your habitat.

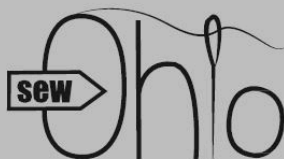
The project showcase is the opportunity to share their

- Advanced – coats and basic tailoring, specialty fabrics and formal wear, career opportunities
- Adult – helping 4-Hers select sewing projects, choosing garment patterns, overlocker vs. serger vs. sewing machine, where to shop for fabrics, How to help your 4-H youth fill out the clothing report form for the state fair
