****Publications Price Adjustment****

In the 2026 Ohio 4-H Project Guide, the standard project book price is \$12. Bulletins and 4-H resource handbooks vary in price based on page count. This move to a tier-pricing structure is intended to create pricing consistency over formats, regardless of distribution numbers. Extension Publishing is committed to changing prices only once a year, in the fall, across all program areas. This pricing schedule is intended to remain in place for the upcoming three to five years. Learning Lab Kits are not affected by this increase.

Purchasing publications through the club via the Extension office will still be the best price for members. It allows for in-state price, tax exempt and no shipping cost to members. (This is not an Ohio 4-H decision).
