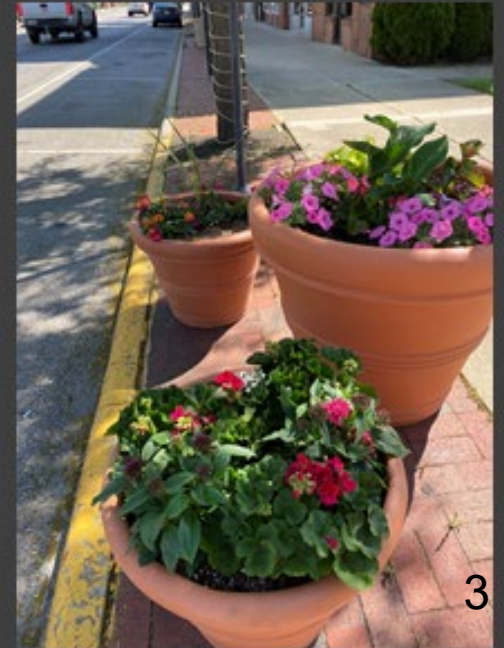

## Hemerocallis (DayLily)

Daylilies were first brought to North America by early European immigrants. Dr. Arlow Burdette Stout, a NY botanist, published a book in 1934, and became known as the father of the modern day Daylily.

The American Daylily Society has been thriving since 1946, and there are over 80,000 registered cultivars.

Most modern hybrids are descended from two types of daylily. One is *Hemerocallis flava*—the yellow lemon lily. The other is *Hemerocallis fulva*, the familiar tawny-orange daylily, also known affectionately as the "ditch lily."

## Diploid –vs- Tetraploid

Most plants have two identical sets of chromosomes, these are called Diploids. Tetraploids have four sets of chromosomes. So what's the difference?

**Diploids** have exquisite flower form, grace and color. Pinks are more prevalent as a diploid Spiders and doubles are more common as diploids. Diploids are easier to cross (hybridize). There are more diploids than Tetraploids.

**Tetraploids** tend to have larger flowers. The colors are more intense and the scapes are stronger and sturdier. Breeding possibilities are greater since they have more chromosomes.

## Foliage

The foliage of daylilies can be blue-green to yellow-green and every color in between. The leaves vary from very slender and grass-like to husky wide and nearly corn-like. The leaves may arch or stand erect. The leaves can range from 6 inches to 36 inches.

For Registration purposes, the foliage is classified as Deciduous, Evergreen and Semi-Evergreen.

Deciduous leaves die completely as winter approaches. They stop growing and form resting buds at the crown and the foliage dies down naturally and gradually. In the spring, the buds have a distinctive spear-like appearance as they emerge.

Evergreen leaves retain their leaves throughout the year. They do not form resting buds, instead they continue producing new leaves unless cold weather prevents growth. In mild climates the leaves remain green all winter. In colder climates, the foliage is almost always frozen, but the crown survives if it is hardy and well mulched.

Semi-Evergreen leaves are those that remain green and retain their leaves in the South, but lose all its leaves in the North.



## Colors

The original daylily color was shades of yellow, orange, fulvous (a dull reddish yellow) and rosy-fulvous. Today, the only colors lacking are pure white and pure blue, although hybridizers avidly pursue these colors.

The Basic Flower color, the outer color, are:

Yellow- all shades from the palest lemon through bright yellow and gold to orange.

Red- diverse shades of scarlet, carmine, tomato-red, maroon, wine-reds and blackish-reds.

Pink- from pale pink through rose pink to rose red.

Purple- from pale lavender and lilac to deep grape and violet.

Melon or cream-pink- from palest cream shades to deep cantaloupe shades.

Buff, Brown, Apricot and Peach are though to be variations of pink plus yellow.

Near whites are found among the palest tints of yellow, pink, lavender and melon.
